# Bi-Monthly Open Meetings

- **Meets approximately every other month throughout the year**
- **Each meeting is hosted by one of the participating congregations**
- **Meetings feature**
  - **Feature updates on PC(USA) global mission activities**
  - **Include presentations from mission projects from throughout the Presbytery and visiting mission speakers**
  - **Provide an opportunity to share and learn as well as to get to know people who share your interest in global mission**
- **Typically between 15 and 30 participants from different congregations across the Presbytery**
- **Most meetings include a presentation by a recipient of a Global Mission Grant to report on progress**
  - **Requirement of the grant program**

- **Global mission funding has varied over the past 10 years**
- **Consistent focus on**
  - **PCUSA Mission Worker Support**
  - **International Seminary Support**
- **Since 2006, grant programs for congregations have been offered for**
  - **Global Partnership Grants**
  - **NCP Global Networks**

# NCP Global Mission Grant Programs

- **Global Mission Partnership Grants:** Matching (1 to 1) grants to congregations for hands-on partnership projects for up to \$5000 each grant
  - Objective is to enable congregations to initiate or expand engagement with global partners
    - Applications accepted twice a year, grants for projects lasting up to three years
  - Began in 2006 and continues with over 40 grants awards for over a total of \$200,000
  - *More details on subsequent slides*
- **NCP Mission Network Grants:** Grants of up to \$1000 per year to chartered NCP Mission Networks
  - Directed at the objective of the MCC to *“Increase the collective relationships among the congregations and between those with similar passions.”*
  - To incentivize the creation and collective action of multiple congregations with common interests or passions to build a community of action and shared commitments through the creation of NCP mission networks with 3 or more congregations who have a shared passion for work in a particular area (e.g. country or region or mission need (e.g. water))
  - Began in 2010; Three chartered networks: Kenya, Malawi and Cuba

- Partnership grants began in 2006 with funding from the Second Alexandria Fund
- From the outset these grants focused on enabling congregation to initiate and expand mission efforts with global partners
- In 2007-8, 18 grants were awarded for a total of \$89,500, with equal matching funds from Congregations

# Global Mission Partnership Grants - Criteria

## Under Resurrection Fund

- Must be **interactive/hands-on** global mission.
- **Impact on the community** should be maximized; preference will be given to projects serving the largest number of people.
- Some **sweat equity** by the recipient community is expected.
- This is a 1-to-1 matching grant. The contribution of your congregation toward the project in both money and volunteer labor will be considered. Exceptions to the match may be made for hardship situations.
- A written report and **presentation** will be required in the year following the award outlining how the funds were spent, the progress of the project to date including impact on the community, and plans for the future.
- Preference will be given to new initiatives. An application may be submitted for continued funding in years two and **three** of a given project.
- Some preliminary work should be done to assess feasibility before applying. The project should have a reasonable chance of success, and some way to **measure success**.
- Priority will be given to projects where there is an **established relationship** and a high level of confidence in the in-country team.
- **Sustainability** must be demonstrated. At some point the congregation will bow out and the community served must take ownership of the project.
- Projects with Presbyterian ecumenical partners are encouraged.
- Travel costs will not be considered.
- A congregation may submit only one application each year.
- No grants for reimbursement of previous expenses will be considered. If for some reason funds cannot be spent as intended, they must be returned.
